2022 Washington College Archaeology Field School May 18 – June 22

The Department of Anthropology is pleased to announce a <u>6-credit</u> archaeological field school [ANT 296] at an early colonial site that served as the first county seat of Caroline County. The area was also home to American Indian settlement and activity.

In partnership with the Maryland Historical Trust [MHT], students will excavate historic structures – cellars, privies, and storage pits – identified through MHT remote sensing surveys and uncovered by the 2021 Archaeology Field School.











Participants will engage in all phases of field archaeology and laboratory analysis, including site discovery techniques, surveying, stratigraphic excavation, and recording. Working at Barwick's Ordinary provides students the opportunity to gain experience at a prehistoric **and** an historic site, all in one field school.

Tuition for the 2022 Archaeology Field School is \$2,300.
