2013: Anthropology splits from Sociology and becomes a stand-alone department

2013: Anthropology adds a third new line

2014: ANT initiates the Ethnomusicology minor with Music

2016: ANT contributes to new minors in Communications and Media Studies and Public Health

2018: One replacement hire

2019: ANT contributes to new Communications and Media Studies major and Arts Management and Entrepreneurship minor
